THE VENTURA COLLEGE FOUNDATION

ONE: The name of this Corporation is THE VENTURA COLLEGE FOUNDATION.

TWO: This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for public and charitable purposes. The public purposes for which this corporation is organized include the promotion of the general welfare of Ventura College by assisting and supporting the attainment of educational, scientific and cultural goals, by assisting it in fulfilling its role of service to its community, by soliciting and distributing money for its facilities, equipment beautification and any other educational outlay needed for scholarships, loans and grants to students.

THREE: The name and address in this State of the corporation's initial agent for service of process is Dr. Richard A. Glenn, 4667 Telegraph Road, Ventura, California 93003.

FOUR: (a) The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable purposes, and no part of the net income or assets of this organization shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer or member of this corporation, or to the benefit of any private individual.

- (b) Upon the dissolution and winding up of this corporation, and after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the corporation, the remaining assets shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation that is organized or operated exclusively for charitable purposes and that has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- FIVE: (a) This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this corporation.
- (b) No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, nor shall this corporation participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of Statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for political office.
