Scored separately are the **Phoenix essay (pg. 5)** and the **optional supplemental essays (pg. 6)** that follow the same point scale as both required essays in the table above. Students who submit responses for the Phoenix and/or supplemental essays become eligible for additional scholarship opportunities. These scholarship awards, however, are not granted just by essay submission but are scored and ranked accordingly. Points earned for the Phoenix and optional are only utilized for scholarships that require those responses.

Prompt: What area(s) of study are you excited/passionate about and why? Did an experience or mentor lead you to this interest? What career goals do you have that align with this interest? If you have not yet chosen a field of study, how do you see Ventura College assisting you in exploring different paths of study and eventually leading to a career path? Please elaborate on your plans to achieve your goals and what activities you're doing now (through work or otherwise) to support those goals. Explain how a scholarship can help you.

700 POINTS: ESSAY #2 CONTENT – NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

Prompt: Describe how you contribute to the well-being of your community. Discuss your participation in and what you have learned from school or other extracurricular activities, family responsibilities, volunteer work, employment, a particular hobby or other interests. If you have been unable to contribute to the community, tell us why you could not (for example: part-time job, children, lack of transportation or other reasons) and what you would do if you had the time/resources/energy available to participate. If applicable, explain how these experiences align with possible career goals.

Prompt: Tell us about your educational journey as a re-entry student, especially any hardships or extenuating circumstances, which resulted in the pause in your education. Please also elaborate why you have decided to complete your education and how your education will support your career goals.

Prompt: How do you demonstrate a commitment to and/or leadership in advocating for ____? You may include community service work, education, employment, involvement in related student clubs or organizations, etc.

Options include gender equality, immigrant (documented and/or undocumented) rights, Hispanic/Latinx/Mexican communities, African American/Black communities, Native American communities, social justice and/or anti-racism.
